The following is what I received in my email this morning after signing up with the evacuee registration form earlier.

Subject: East Troublesome Evacuation Winter Hazard Mitigation Assistance Form

Thank you for registering with the East Troublesome Fire Evacuee(s) Registration form. We are well aware of the concerns with fire and cold weather in this unprecedented time. Grand County Sheriff, Brett Schroetlin, has developed a program to minimize potential damage due to plumbing issues with approaching weather. Through this partnership and with your permission, Deputies will be accompanying registered contractors to your homes to mitigate plumbing and water damage. This program is voluntary and there is no cost. This program is available only as fire conditions, weather, and access will allow.

Below is the process start to finish:

1. Complete the attached form - <https://forms.gle/G4UUKTBPEmQF92NY6>
2. The contractor will contact you by phone when they reach your house. Answer your phone to discuss access to your home and plumbing systems.
3. The contractor will ask you a series of questions via telephone. If the contractor is unable to reach you, the contractor must move on to the next home to maximize our efforts.
4. In the event of damage to your home, you will be notified by Grand County Sheriff's Office. However, the official notification of damage will follow the damage assessment process. This is an effort to ensure honesty and transparency with Grand County property owners, while allowing the formal process to follow.
