All CLCC Owners,

Please read very carefully so you do not miss any of the important information. We are sending this information as a courtesy to keep you updated on the decisions from Grand County. CLCC has not been involved with these decisions and is merely just passing on the information and ask you to refrain from supplying your opinions to us. CLCC is sorry to say we tried to get priority access to those who lost their homes and unfortunately Grand County Emergency Officials would not agree to this.

This process is set up by the Sheriff's office for restricted "visitation" (not re-entry) for CLCC and surrounding neighborhoods.

Access will be granted from

Tomorrow, Saturday, October 31st, from 1 PM to 3 PM.

OR

Tuesday, Nov 3rd from 1 PM to 3 PM.

Credentials, in the form of an orange plastic card, will be issued at the Disaster Assistance Center (DAC) located at The Inn at Silver Creek, [62927 US-40](#) in Granby across from the City Market during DAC hours. Please use the entrance to the Conference Center on the north side of the building.

The DAC will be open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Face masks will be required in the facility. COVID protocols and screening will be in place. You **MUST** first go to the DAC at Silver Creek Inn to obtain your orange pass before entering CLCC.

Plan on arriving **EARLY**, as it will take at least half an hour drive to CLCC entrance, with everyone trying to enter at once, plus the **Credential process could take up to 2 hours**. There will be other evacuated neighborhoods entering their homes at the same time, so it will be very busy. **You will be escorted by law enforcement to CLCC, and there will be a hard stop at 3 PM**, and all **MUST** leave by then - no exceptions, even if you were last in line and did not get the full 2 hours at your home.

This visitation entry is not intended for you to return to living in your home. This is an opportunity to check the status of your property and you will be escorted in **and** out by local first responders. Visitation permission is only to obtain needed medications, clothes, special items, etc., and take assessment and pictures of the damage.

It is our understanding that you may only go one day or the other, not both.

Credentials needed to obtain entry badge at Silver Creek Inn (across from City Market in Granby):

What you need to bring to obtain credentials:

To show proof of residency and/or ownership, you will need to present one of the following forms of identification to receive credentials:

- Government-issued photo ID with an address inside the affected area

- Copy of a current utility bill with your name and address inside the affected area plus a government-issued photo ID
- Grand County Assessor record of property ownership in the affected area plus a government-issued photo ID
- Rental agreement/lease with your name and address in the affected area plus a government-issued photo ID

If you do not have the above documentation, bring what you can to prove who you are and where you live/own property. Credentials will only be issued to residents and property owners from current mandatory evacuation areas. The card will contain a barcode, your name, and address. Only one card will be issued per household/property. This process will allow for better accountability and help safeguard your property. It is also extremely important to limit access to hazardous areas until the areas are safe for re-entry. These credential cards will be used in the future to provide escorted entry into the area of your home or property as identified by the address on your card.

Additional visitors (insurance agents, contractors, family members) may accompany you in the same vehicle during your scheduled visit of two hours. **No additional vehicles may enter with you. No trailers or oversized vehicles will be allowed in the evacuation area.** Please keep in mind that this is a hazardous area with downed trees and power lines, nails, hazardous materials, and difficult access. This is not an environment for small children or pets.
